

- Theology, not journalism




The gospels were written to be heard!

The majority of people in the time of the gospel writers and early Christians could not read and were dependent on hearing things read to them.

Even those that could read tended to read things aloud to themselves.

The gospels were intended to stimulate the ear as much as the eye.

** Pro tip - reading aloud also slows us down slightly; forcing us to give every word sand phrase tis due and so resist the temptation to skip over what we think we already know.



THE LITURGICAL YEAR-A

- The lectionary is a set of readings used for the liturgy of the word during celebrations of the Eucharist.
- The church uses a 3-year cycle in its Sunday lectionary -

Year A - Gospel of Matthew

Year B - Gospel of Mark (some John is added)

Year C-Gospel of Luke


THE GOSPELACCORDING TO MATTHEW



 Individual stories remembered from stories circulated in the community.

 Some stories placing was obvious – birth, baptism before ministry...

• The stories, as told, came with little in the way of a time frame. For example, which stories occurred before the journey to Jerusalem, which ones on the road there, and which ones actually took place in Jerusalem?



Activity 1 -

- 1. In your group, put the stories from Matthew's gospel into the order that you would put them if you were writing an account of the life of Jesus.
- 2. Make sure you justify with each other why you put stories where you do.

ACTIVITY 2 -

- 1. Compare your order with Matthew's and discuss what you find:
 - · How close were you?
 - · Did you use some of the criteria that Matthew appears to have used?
 - · What have you noticed about how Matthew put his gospel together?

Matthew:

- 1. Plotted out the life events of Jesus first.
- 2. Gathered similar passages together into blocks or discourses of speeches.
- 7. The two passages from the activity which name and send out the twelve disciples are from the block on the missionary activity of the disciples.

The story of Jesus is not affected by the fact that the Evangelists relate the words and deed of Jesus in a different order, and express his sayings not literally, but differently, while preserving their sense. ~ Instruction Concerning the Historical Truth of the Gospels (1964)






Matthew chapter 10 - the missionary discourse

THE FIVE DISCOURSES OF MATTHEW-DISCOURSE FOUR

Matthew chapter 18 - the discourse on the Church.

Some parables which also refer to the Kingdom of Heaven.



General theme is the anticipation of a future community of followers and the role the disciples have in leading the community.

Emphasises the importance of humility and self-sacrifice within this community - child-like humility, not social clout.

THE FIVE DISCOURSES OF MATTHEW-DISCOURSE FIVE

Matthew chapters 23-25 - the Olivet (given on the Mt of Olives) or end of times discourse

Mostly about judgement and the expected conduct of followers of Jesus.
