
Second Rite of Reconciliation Advent 2010 Year A Welcoming Christ

Welcome

The reflections for this evening's celebration are based on the bee. The bee is a symbol of wisdom; it is wise enough to know where to collect nectar from flowers and to turn it into sweet honey. We should be wise enough to take what we are given (our nectar) and daily transform our lives, making them sweeter.

On the columns of the canopy covering the Altar in St Peter's Basilica in Rome there are bees among the leaves and flowers. It is also traditional in the Church for the candles on the altar and the Paschal candle to be of beeswax. Beeswax is a natural product made from the bee's act of selfless work. General Confession of Sins

Priest: My sisters and brothers, confess your

sins and pray for each other, that you may be healed. Together we pray...

All.

I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned through my own fault in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do.

And I ask Mary, ever virgin, all the angels and saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord

our God.

Priest.

The Lord is merciful. He makes us clean of heart and leads us out into his freedom when we acknowledge our guilt. Let us ask him to forgive and lead us in the way of truth and love.



Invitation to Individual Confession and Absolution.

(At the end of the individual confessions and absolutions, before the concluding prayer, encourage those gathered to continue leading good lives which will proclaim the grace of repentance in the life of the entire community and each of its members.)
