Commitment Statement

The Diocese of Broome is committed to providing safe and secure environments for its children and adults and its leaders, employees and volunteers. Safeguarding strategies are guided by the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards, are subject to independent audit and feedback is welcome for continual improvement.

Welcome to the first edition of **The Guardian** – the Diocese of Broome's very own Safeguarding newsletter. Its purpose is to communicate Safeguarding information across the Diocese, showcase parish activities and introduce key people.

For people of the Diocese who may not have been reached (yet!), Safeguarding is a set of practices applied to Church life to ensure children and adults are able to freely and safely engage in parish activities. Safeguarding acknowledges the failure of the Church to provide this in the past and now takes a zero-tolerance approach as it seeks to prevent abuse of any kind in the future.

At first glance, the wordy documents of the Safeguarding framework might appear rigid and restrictive to our otherwise relaxed participation in church activities. However, people have expressed to me the reassurance it gives them to engage fully in their diverse roles. I liken it to wearing a seatbelt or installing a smoke alarm – when these are in place we can go about our daily life and work in confidence of their protection.

Did you know?...

Diocese of Broome Safeguarding is based on the *10 National Catholic Safeguarding Standards* which are divided into *49 Criteria* and *111 Indicators*. The 10 *Standards* are:

- 1. Committed leadership, governance and culture
- 2. Children and adults are safe, informed and participate
- 3. Partnering with families, carers and communities
- 4. Equity is promoted and diversity is respected
- 5. Robust human resource management
- 6. Effective complaints management
- 7. Ongoing education and training
- 8. Safe physical and online environments
- 9. Continuous improvement
- 10. Policies and procedures support the safety of children and adults
